AMERICA'S HEROES Flight 93 Memorial ~ Flight 93 Memorial Chapel Quecreek Mine Rescue Tour to run approx. 8-9 hours

Somerset County, Pennsylvania has been called "America's County" because of the two life-changing events in which heroes lived and died in 2001 and 2002. We invite you to come and experience the places and hear the stories.

COMING FROM THE EAST: Pick up local guide at Sheetz just off Bedford Exit of PA Turnpike, Exit 146. It is best to have a rest stop prior to arrival here, perhaps Sidling Hill or Midway on pike. FROM THE WEST A CONVENIENT LOCATION WILL BE SET.

Pay your respects at the Flight 93 National Memorial including both the Memorial Plaza with the Wall of Names of the Heroes of Flight 93 and the Visitor Center, dedicated on Sept 10, 2015. The exhibits in the Visitor Center bring back poignant memories as well as providing new insight into the events and the heroes of Flight 93. Phase 3 of the National Memorial, "The Tower of Voices," was dedicated in September of 2018. The 93-foot-tall tower housing 40 windchimes is now complete

and provides harmonious sounds reminding us of the 40 Heroes who came together and gave their lives in order to save this flight from reaching its intended target. *NOTE: the chimes are heard based on wind speed*. Each tour member receives a commemorative magnet "Remember the Heroes of Flight 93."

Lunch at Our Coal Miners Diner is a plated meal of hot roast beef or hot turkey sandwich, mashed potatoes/gravy, beverage and dessert OR grilled chicken salad w/roll, beverage & dessert. Option: Oakhurst Grill offering a buffet meal.

Your spirits will soar as you visit the Quecreek Mine Rescue site where, on July 28th, 2002 nine miners were miraculously rescued from 240 feet beneath the earth in a farmer's field just outside of Somerset. Hear of the events from the time the accident occurred until the last miner was brought up and you will understand that God was at work here. The rescue site has been developed into a beautiful garden and you will see the actual rescue capsule, the broken drill bit and many more artifacts from the Quecreek rescue and mining in general in the Educational Visitor Center.

Visit the Flight 93 Memorial Chapel, which was dedicated, on the first anniversary of 9/11 to honor God and the memory of the 40 heroes of Flight 93. In the chapel you see many moving mementos donated by family members and others who wish to honor the heroes. Hearts are touched as you visit the chapel and the Flight 93 Crew Monument in the garden area behind the chapel. Donated by United Airlines Flight Attendants Cause Foundation, the monument entitled "Forever in Our Hearts" is a 16-ton black granite obelisk.

Possible additions to your day:

- Shop at a local Mennonite owned store ... adds about 40 minutes. Ice cream cone or cup may be included at an additional \$3.50/pp.
- Somerset Historical Center ~ see demo, maple syrup...adds about 1 hour and \$7
- Glades Pike Winery for tasting....adds about 45 minutes and \$2

Here you find a large store with dozens of individual booths featuring items from individual suppliers offering florals, knits, candles, candies, jewelry, kitchen items, home décor and much more. 
